State-of-the-Art Green Facility Boasts Over 500,000 sq. ft. of space

(Virginia Beach, Va., 2009) – In the midst of a bustling metropolitan city on the edge of a dramatic coastline, Virginia Beach is the perfect destination for a rich meeting experience. This locale, combined with the Virginia Beach Convention Center, provides a perfect backdrop for meetings, conventions and trade shows for groups throughout the country.

Virginia Beach laid the groundwork to become one of the nation’s most sought after year-round meeting destinations. Center stage in the city’s renaissance is the \$202.5 million Virginia Beach Convention Center. The facility, now certified green, boasts more than 500,000 gross square feet of space and includes a 150,000 sq. ft. column-free exhibit hall, 28,929 sq. ft. of meeting space and a 31,029 sq. ft. ballroom. Serviced by a seasoned staff of service-oriented professionals, the facility offers competitive rates, 2,230 free parking spaces and is situated just blocks from one of the mid-Atlantic’s most beautiful beaches.

“The facility was designed to provide convention attendees with a first-class Convention Center that offers flexibility and premier amenities throughout the building,” said James B. Ricketts, director of the Virginia Beach Convention & Visitors Bureau. “The new Virginia Beach Convention Center offers the quality and excellence that meeting planners have come to expect.”

Virginia Beach Convention Center Exterior

In today’s world, a meeting must be an experience. World-renowned architectural firm Skidmore Owings & Merrill LLP (SOM) captured the essence of the coastal destination in the Convention Center’s design and theme.

Dynamic use of water, wood and natural light is integrated throughout the building. At the Convention Center's entrance, a soaring, nautical glass-curtain wall appears to float in pools of water both inside and outside the building. Guests walk across wooden boardwalks to access the building. A "porch-like" venue for an outdoor experience is adjacent to an enclosed pre-function area in front of the ballroom. From the 10-story observation deck, attendees can view the oceanfront skyline, as well as observe the incredible air-mastery of the F/A-18 Super Hornets based at Naval Air Station Oceana.

Virginia Beach Convention Center Interior

Inside the Virginia Beach Convention Center, the exhibit hall - divisible by four - features 40-foot ceilings along with 10 ft. x 10 ft. grids permanently etched into the floor to facilitate setting up of exhibits. Easy access to the exhibit halls is provided by 21 loading docks and four street-level ramps. Each of the four hall subdivisions are supported by services including: meeting room suites, concessions, ample and handsomely appointed pre-function and registration spaces, show management offices overlooking the exhibit hall, conveniently located registration, storage rooms and other support areas. An expansive video wall, four 90 ft. x 9 ft. sections, provides both art and information to the pre-function area.

State-of-the-Art Technology

The Convention Center provides the latest in wired and wireless communications technologies. The wood-paneled, 31,029 square-foot ballroom utilizes programmable LED lighting to provide special effects lighting never before used in a ballroom. Ample electrical service is supplied to the ballroom, as well as an overhead grid of rigging points to support the most demanding of special audio or visual requirements. Utility service is provided on a 30-foot grid in the exhibit hall floor and contains 60 or 100-amp electrical service, fiber optic and category-VI cable, water and drain service. A network of empty 6-inch conduits is located throughout the exhibit hall to support special needs. Similar amenities are located throughout the meeting rooms, the ballroom and all pre-function spaces.

Accommodations and Beyond the Convention Center

With nearly 12,000 hotel rooms citywide and 3,500 committable rooms within a 2-mile radius of the Convention Center, Virginia Beach offers every kind of accommodation.

New properties include a 236-room Westin located at Town Center, the city's new downtown area, as well as a new Spring Hill Suites by Marriott at the Virginia Beach oceanfront. Getting Here

Situated at the midway point on the East Coast, Virginia Beach is a mere four hours from Washington, D.C. and only within a day's drive or less for over two-thirds of the nation's population. Norfolk International Airport services the entire greater region, with over 200 flights daily from most major U.S. carriers, including Southwest Airlines and Independence Air. The airport is only 18 miles, or about 20 minutes, from the oceanfront area.
